### 1. Call to Order

Mayor Daniels called the meeting to order at 7:00 pm and handed the Chair to Cr. Fergusson.

Cr. Fergusson read the acknowledgement of First Nations.

### 3. Delegations

a. Natalie Anderson

Mrs. Anderson spoke on the denial of her home occupation permit for river guiding and hosting. To Mrs. Anderson's understanding, the denial was in part because of lack of information provided on the application. Mrs. Anderson stated that her and her husband have become the de facto landing pad for international and out-of-town paddlers as they are some of the only people that can show people around all of the rapids safely. Occasionally, they are contacted by a third party to host these paddlers.

The purpose for appearing before council is to see if there is a route forward to figuring out how to make something like this happen and what the concerns are. She understands that most of the concerns seem to be either around noise or traffic. There has never been a complaint from the neighbors.

Cr. Campbell questioned public health and safety with no food preparation places, running water.

Mrs. Anderson stated that there is a house on the lot that is use community, a pump out for septic, and running water from the town as well as a large screened-in deck.

Administration clarified that the main concerns were storage, traffic, parking and onsite camping. What can be done to mitigate those for a successful application?

Mrs. Anderson stated that they will be leasing the lot next door allowing for additional parking. Its not huge amounts of people. The tents are only used for sleeping and they use the house otherwise.

Cr. Campbell stated his concerns about opening a new precedent. There are facilities in this town that tourists can stay at. He does not see how this supports Fort Smith with people using a back yard when we have campsites, hotels, and restaurants.

Cr. Pischinger shared the same concerns with Cr. Campbell while also stating that she supports the business of teaching, just not the overnight hosting.

Cr. Fergusson questioned if Mrs. Anderson charges any fees for what they do.

Mrs. Anderson stated that they typically only ask for a donation for help to offset the utility costs and sometimes when a third party reaches out they will be paid by the third party clinic. They are not operating as a money-making business.

Cr. Tuckey asked if Mrs. Anderson was in contravention of Bylaw 873 or Bylaw 936.

Mrs. Anderson, stated that she does not allow campers on the property and she does not see how this business application fits into the standard bylaws.

Cr. Campbell stated that he would like to see the fire marshal to determine the occupancy load for the building. He does not feel it will meet any of the codes.

Mrs. Anderson said in summary it sounds like there are some concerns over taking business away from potential other parts of town and that council is not opposed to the guiding aspect, however, have concerns over the hosting aspect. In the future if she wanted to host she would need to contact the fire marshal to alleviate the safety and health concerns.

Cr. Fergusson thanked Mrs. Anderson for her delegation.
