

**Discussion** – SAO gave some information as to what it would cost to open the arena earlier than scheduled. There is a significant cost to opening earlier, staff wages, summer maintenance would be affected as staff would need to be at the arena. Council would like actual numbers as to what it would cost to open early, challenges / programs that would be affected. Increase fees for the user group?

Currently the SR bridge has water encroaching. Water crossing at pebble creek, temporary fix, needs to be addressed when spring is here, there was no notice to the community regards to the water crossing being closed or down to one lane.





### 1. Visitor Information Centre is open and staffed

### 2. Marketing
